DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

When disaster strikes, a prepared community can respond quicker, provide more relief, save more lives. LCIF Disaster Preparedness grants support your efforts to collaborate with local authorities and community organizations to prepare for when devastation comes. Awarded between US\$5,000 and US\$10,000, Disaster Preparedness grants can be used for training programs; stockpiling supplies; assembling relief kits; support for first responders, food banks, medical facilities, and shelters; and public outreach activities.

The Carter Center LCIF's partnership with The Carter Center (TCC) has an impressive history. Since 1994, the organizations have collaborated to make massive strides against

two of the most debilitating and painful eye diseases, river blindness and trachoma. LCIF has awarded 60+ grants totaling US\$68 million to bolster TCC and Lions' efforts to stop the spread of these diseases. As a result, the World Health Organization (WHO) verified Colombia, Ecuador, Mexico, and Guatemala free of river blindness, and more than five million residents of Ethiopia, which has the highest prevalence of trachoma alobally, no longer require drugs to prevent the disease.

Partnering with the **World Health Organization** Together, LCIF and the WHO have helped 152 million children globally, a stunning achievement of the partnership to combat avoidable childhood blindness. LCIF has awarded nearly US\$7 million in SightFirst grants to fund the ongoing project, strengthening communities by training primary eye care personnel, developing pediatric surgical teams, improving infrastructure, and establishing low vision services. The partnership has established 56 pediatric eye care centers in 30 countries, and trained 56,000 pediatric eye and healthcare professionals.



HOW DONATION DOLLARS TRANSFORM INTO GRANTS

"Through solid fiscal responsibility, LCIF is committed to making 100 percent of dollars donated available for programs and our service. It doesn't get any better than that!" Couple these words from Past International President and Constitutional Area I Campaign 100 Chairperson Joe Preston with the fact that our communities need Lions more than ever, and you realize the value in donating to LCIF.

"Giving to our foundation and Campaign 100, individually and as a club, has very real benefit to each of us," explained Preston. "LCIF magnifies our ability to serve and the impact of our work by augmenting funds collected locally. Campaign 100 support prior to the pandemic is also one reason LCIF was able to readily provide Constitutional Area I more than US\$850,000 in frontline relief grants and District and Club Community Impact grants (DCGs), and more than US\$5.2 million for pandemic relief worldwide."

DCGs – at the Heart of Community Service Since last July, LCIF has continued funding Lions' pandemic relief work through its DCG program. "DCGs provide great opportunity to continue our COVID-19-related work," said Preston, adding that "If you took advantage of our November Foundation Fridays webinar, you know DCGs are easy to apply for and can be used for a broad spectrum of local service."

Through the DCG program, 15 percent of unrestricted contributions to LCIF are transformed into grants that fund projects on a club and/or district level. Clubs donating US\$5,000 to LCIF in a given Lion year, and districts donating US\$10,000, are eligible to apply for a DCG.

Building Healthier Todays, More Productive Tomorrows

Lions Quest is LCIF's world-renowned social and emotional learning (SEL) curriculum that has helped more than 19 million students feel safer and gain important social and problem-solving skills. It's also the program helping educators at schools challenged by student fighting, bullying, and absenteeism become more effective at developing calmer, more thoughtful, healthier students.

Harvard University found students participating in Lions Quest reported improved perceptions of school climate, and physical and emotional safety*. For 35+ years, LCIF has funded Lions Quest globally. Our commitment to improving the lives of millions of children here and in 100+ countries globally continues.

LIONS QUEST CURRICULA

Evidence-based and proven, Lions Quest is vital for so many of today's youth. Carefully crafted age-specific lessons and exercises delivered by teachers receiving special Lions Quest training, help students thrive.

- Skills for Growing Pre-K to Grade 5: Directs students' energies into becoming capable, healthy young people with sense of direction and strong commitment to family, school, community
- Skills for Adolescence Grades 6-8: Helps students, parents, teachers address physical, emotional, social challenges of early adolescence
- Skills for Action Grades 9-12: Capitalizes on belief that young people with strong character and who expect positive behavior can meaningfully address issues affecting their lives, their community, the world



VONS QUESS

Students learn how to prevent bullying; say no to drugs, tobacco, and alcohol; make responsible decisions; and establish positive relationships. Character development lessons help students become adept at feeling and showing empathy, setting and achieving goals, and managing emotions. The value of helping others, or service learning, is yet another aspect of the program.

MOVING ONLINE COVID-19 has forced remote learning and retooling at warp speed. Responsive to changing education needs, Lions Quest created new resources to ensure students can continue SEL lessons and effectively cope with the pandemic.

Online resources, built on Lions Quest proven approaches, are augmented by the practice of mindfulness. Mindfulness helps create a sense of calm and mental clarity, while SEL promotes self- and social-awareness. Practiced together, this deepens inner well-being and promotes healthier relationships.
